# MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

# STRATEGY, ADVOCACY AND CAPACITY

Over the past year, we have worked with you to strengthen family medicine and the healthcare system. We put core pieces in place to drive meaningful change, including developing a new strategic plan, bolstering our advocacy work and increasing our capacity.

## **SETTING STRATEGY**

After almost a year of gathering insights from family doctors, staff, partners and other stakeholders, we are getting ready to launch our strategic plan to guide us through 2028. We spoke to family doctors at every age and stage of practice and across many regions. The plan reflects our priorities and commitment to strengthen family medicine together. It puts you at the forefront, leading the charge for an equitable, innovative and inclusive system of care for all British Columbians. Stay tuned for our official strategic plan launch in fall 2025!

## **GROWING ADVOCACY**

Our advocacy work is about building your capacity to speak up for family medicine. We are working together to ensure your voices are heard and to drive improvements in the healthcare system.

**Fair Care Everywhere** – In December, we launched Fair Care Everywhere to build a coalition of organizations and individuals advocating for equitable access to healthcare in rural communities. This ongoing campaign is asking to:

- Increase healthcare staffing to reduce wait times and prevent burnout.
- Invest in reliable transportation systems for patients to access care.
- · Provide fair pay for rural doctors and rural healthcare workers.

**Election Advocacy Toolkits** – Leading up to the 2024 provincial election and the 2025 federal election this April, we supported you with comprehensive election toolkits:

- Speak out for Family Medicine: Prioritizing Patient Care Our joint provincial election 2024 toolkit created with the BC College of Family Physicians.
- Make Healthcare a Priority this Election! Our federal election 2025 toolkit.

**Minister and MLA Meetings** – We met with BC's new Minister of Health, Josie Osborne, to discuss our priorities for healthcare reform and how to support the needs of family doctors and patients. We also met with MLA Anna Kindy, Opposition Critic for Healthcare, and MLA Brennan Day, Opposition Critic for Rural Health, to discuss our shared priority of a stronger primary care system.



## **NEGOTIATING PMA PRIORITIES**

Negotiations for the 2025 Physician Master Agreement began this spring. Our priorities are about strengthening the future of family medicine and the healthcare system. We aim to:

- Modernize and create equity in physician compensation.
- · Reduce administrative burdens.
- Expand business and practice supports.
- · Support physician health and wellbeing.
- · Enhance family physician respect and representation.
- Build the future of primary care.

## **BUILDING CAPACITY**

To support our ambitious plans and enhance our member services, we have doubled the size of our staff team – from four to eight!

We welcomed Alex Luongo, Operations and Administration Coordinator, Grace Atim-Olal, Physician Compensation Coordinator, Oona Palmer, Policy Advisor, and Harshita Srivastava, Digital Content and Communications Coordinator. Thanks to Rachel Garrick, Communications Manager, for setting the foundation of our communications work. We wish her well on her future endeavours.

For years, we've called on the provincial government to put an end to sick notes. In April, the government announced plans to eliminate sick notes for short absences.

Every policy change that reduces doctors administrative burden moves us toward better care for patients.

# PHYSICIAN COMPENSATION

## **CELEBRATING TWO YEARS OF PROGRESS**

Two years ago, nearly one million British Columbians were without a family doctor. The primary care system was in crisis and doctors were leaving family medicine due to financial strain, administrative burdens and burnout.

The Longitudinal Family Physician (LFP) payment model has transformed the way family doctors care for patients. You've shared that this new payment model is helping you stay in, or return to, practice. In the last two years, more than 1,000 new family doctors are practicing in BC. Today, more British Columbians have a family doctor.

Since its inception in February 2023, we have made hundreds of improvements based on your input. In 2024, we expanded the payment model to recognize the care that family doctors provide in facility-based settings, enabling you to bill for:

- Long-term care
- Hospital care
- Palliative care
- Maternity care

Your stories and the impact of the LFP payment model on all British Columbians – from Fort St. John to Invermere to Victoria – are highlighted in our report: <a href="Two Years of Progress: Celebrating">Two Years of Progress: Celebrating</a> the Impact of the LFP Payment Model. The report showcases the collaboration between our organization, Doctors of BC and the Ministry of Health to create this transformative new physician compensation model.

We have more work to do to make the LFP payment model more equitable and reflective of BC's diverse communities.

## **IMPROVING FEE-FOR-SERVICE**

We know that no single compensation model will meet the diverse needs of family doctors. Many family doctors need or prefer other compensation options. Fee-for-service must remain a viable choice for longitudinal and focused practice family doctors. We are working for you too!

We are simplifying the family medicine fee guide to make billing easier. We are modernising fee codes to reflect 21st century care in alignment with LFP payment model principles.

The 2022 PMA provided targeted funding for family medicine fee codes in addition to general fee increases. As a result, BC Family Doctors has been able to increase fees for the first time in a decade.

Almost all fees received an increase. Some were prioritized for larger increases based on priorities you identified in our 2023 member survey:

- Surgical assists
- Reproductive and sexual health care
- Substance use care
- · Visits, counselling and consultations
- Immunizations and injections
- Clinic-based visits and procedures
- · Delegable fees
- Facility-based care (surgical assists, labour and birth, inpatient, long-term care)
- Time-based fees

More funding is needed from the 2025 PMA to ensure that all family medicine fees reflect modern medical practice. We're committed to improving compensation for family physicians across all payment models, ensuring equitable and fair remuneration as well as quality patient care.
